## **Portugal - Child Guarantee National Action Plan Overview**

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This overview presents highlights extracted from the National Action Plan (NAP) from Portugal published on 06/02/2023. It is not exhaustive nor does it evaluate the NAP and uses the same terms as those in the NAP. It is intended to summarise key elements & to signpost stakeholders to other relevant analyses.

#### Planned key services and actions

- Early Childhood Education and Care: Implementation of the Mental Health and Parenting Programme in Primary Health Care Support: ensuring free kindergartens for all;
- Education: Provision of necessary equipment in school; creation of "accompanied study spaces"; implementation of informal and non-formal education:
- Healthcare: Access to proximity consultations in Primary Healthcare services; free access to mental health facilities for children in poverty; extension of suicide prevention programmes;
- Nutrition: Provision of a free meal at school every day; initiatives on healthy eating;
- Housing: Implementing the Housing Access Support Programme; access to emergency or transitional housing solutions;
- Children in Alternative Care: Strengthening the network of institutions covering host family care response; pedagogical support for children in childcare residences.

### **Stakeholder Engagement**

Both Children and Civil Society Organisations have been involved in the drafting of the NAP.

In the consultation process several methodologies were adopted: the request and reception of written contributions, holding of meetings, promotion of reflection forums and questionnaires.

The NAP includes a very extensive overview of different indicators, including indicators on children in alternative care, directed at each concrete measure.

There is also a vulnerability indicator that summarizes particularly vulnerable situations of children and young people.
