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Planned key services and actions

- Early Childhood Education and Care: Improving cognitive, emotional and pro-social skills of children, development of care staff capacities and flexible forms of care
- Education: Introduction of inclusive education, implementation of flexible education programmes, development of comprehensive skills and literacy, programmes for Roma students
- Healthcare: Collection of data on health conditions and inequalities, provision of information on access to health care, strengthening staff qualifications
- Nutrition: Ensuring effective access to a healthy diet
- **Housing:** Ensuring affordable housing, through Housing First providing accessible housing, promoting the settlement of ownership among Roma people
- Children in Alternative Care: Establishing a network of professional support for children, improving the performance of professional foster care, supporting integration and inclusion of children with disabilities placed in care
