Romania - Child Guarantee National Action Plan Overview

National Coordinator: Mr Rares ACHIIRILOAIE – President National Authority for the Protection of Children's Rights and Adoption

This overview presents highlights extracted from the National Action Plan (NAP) from Romania. It is not exhaustive nor does it evaluate the NAP and uses the same terms as those in the NAP. It is intended to summarise key elements & to signpost stakeholders to other relevant analyses.

Children in need	
Rural children	They account for 48% of the population and are at higher risk of social exclusion
Children with disabilities	They are affected by a combination of exclusions factors. They account for 30% of the children in alternative care.
Roma children	High inequalities in terms of equal opportunities, living conditions and access to public services. e.g. 68% live in household that are not connected to the public water and sewage network, as opposed to 38,1% for the general population.
Children from migrant families	In 2020, 73 136 children had one or both parents working abroad. In 2022, 4811 unacompanied children were registered.
Teenage mothers	In 2021, 687 births were to mothers under the age of 15 and 15 672 to teenagers aged 15-19.
Children in alternative care	In 2021, 47 029 (8 408 are children with disabilities) were under State care; on average, they spend 7,5 years in the social protection system.
Young people leaving care	3000 young people leave care each year without appropriate support.

Planned key services and actions Social services: Address day centres, residential

centres, counselling centres and rehabilitation

centres; Curve the severe shortage of staff, especially in rural areas and increase specialised staff **Health and nutrition**: School Programme for the provision of fruits and vegetables, dairy and bakery products; pilot programme providing hot meals in communities to reduce early school leaving; regular preventive examination once a year; community health nurse in every rural community lacking healthcare services **Housing:** National Housing Strategy 2022-2050 leaning on inclusive housing, affordable housing and quality public services, green transition, administrative capacity building Education: "Educated Romania" Programme to ensure early childhood education and care; ensure training and professionalisation of the staff, extended childcare
